



### CLINICAL LEAD QI DIABETES IN SURGERY – a new joint role with the CENTRE FOR PERIOPERATIVE CARE (CPOC) & ROYAL COLLEGE OF SURGEONS OF ENGLAND

The Centre for Perioperative Care (CPOC) is a cross-organisational, multidisciplinary collaborative between patients and the public, Royal Colleges and similar organisations. CPOC was established in 2019 to facilitate and promote the delivery of high-quality perioperative care; the integrated multidisciplinary management of patients from the moment surgery is contemplated through to full recovery.

**CPOC and RCS England are now inviting applications for a Clinical Lead for a Quality Improvement Diabetes in Surgery project. CPOC/RCS England are looking for consultant or equivalent senior level healthcare professional with an interest in diabetes from any specialty.**

#### Clinical Lead Quality Improvement Diabetes in Surgery

CPOC and the RCS England are offering an exciting opportunity for a clinical lead for a new diabetes in surgery quality improvement project. They will be supported by the RCS England council lead and the Centre for Perioperative Care executive lead, the quality improvement consultant/team and the project manager/ project co-ordinator. **The first two phases of the project will be unremunerated.** These include: project scoping and initiation, recruitment, payment and set-up. These phases are planned to take place from September 2022 to May 2023. Provided we get to a point where we have sufficient sites register for the project, we expect that the set-up, launch and testing will commence from June 2023. In this event RCS England will be in a position to formally contract the clinical lead to continue leadership of the project.
