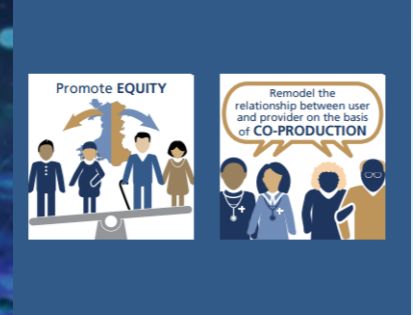

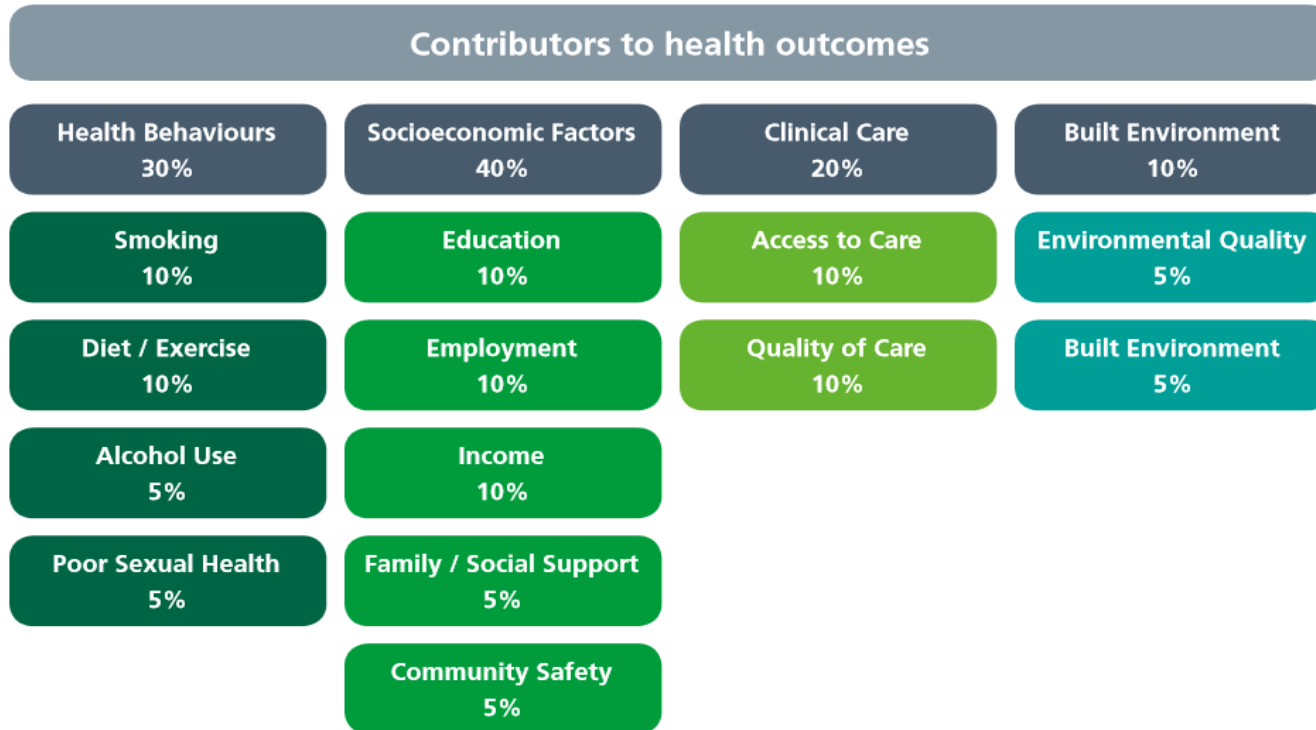

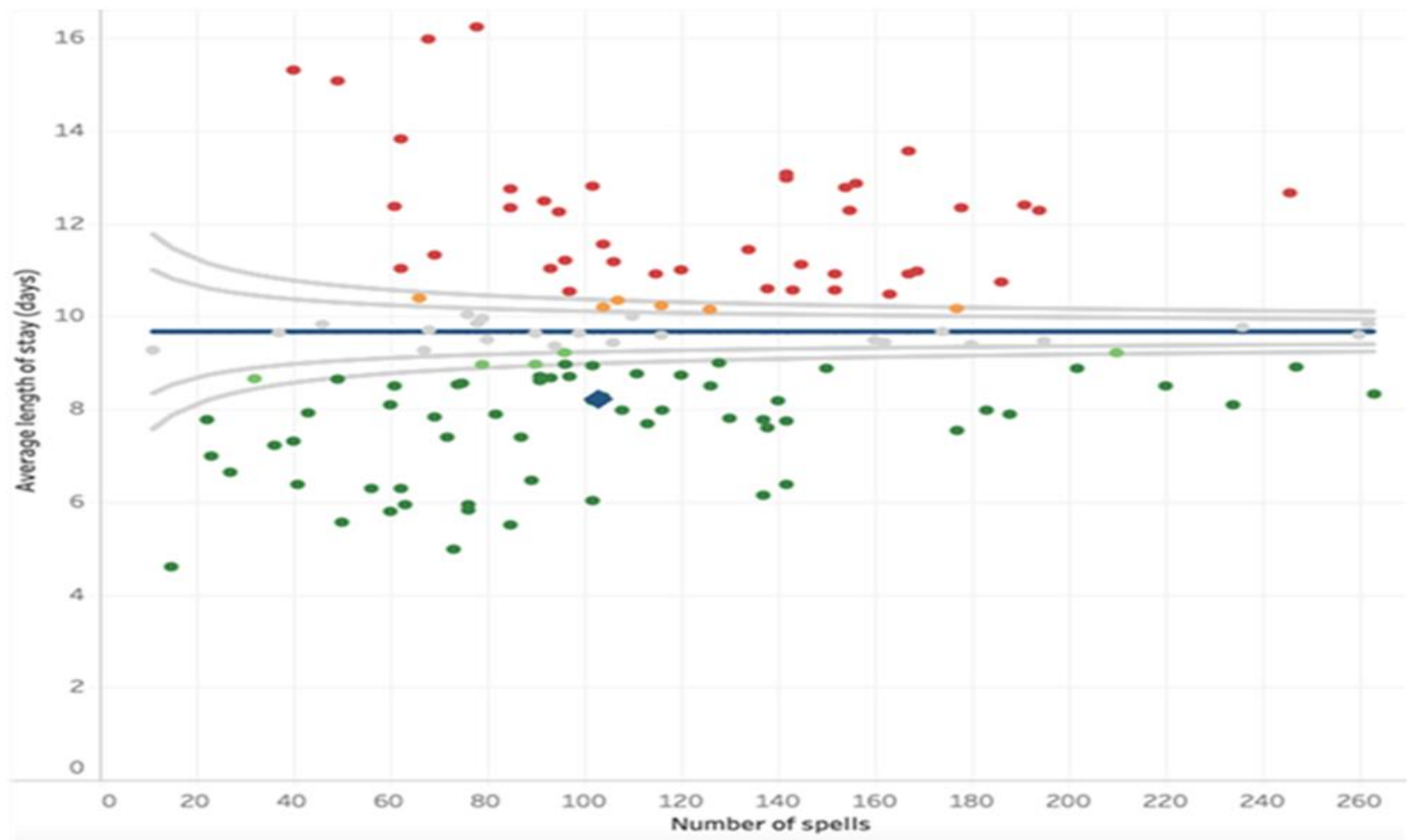

Figure 1: **Understanding the wider determinants of health**

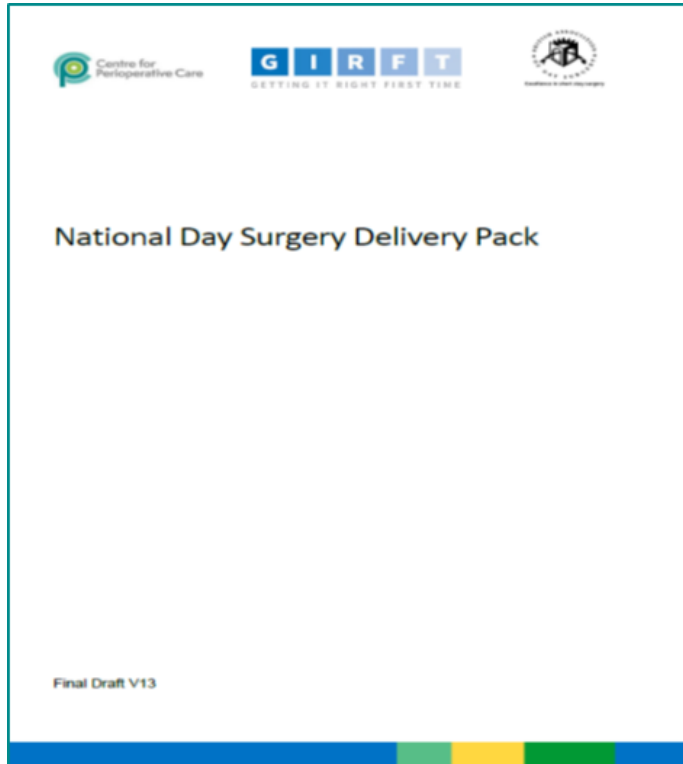



Aspect	Consideration	What is CPOC doing?
Pathway & Ownership	'Surgery is a punctuation' Individual <i>versus</i> team	Building across organisations to develop necessary culture, behaviours
Clinical guidelines	Specialty/professional <i>versus</i> patient centred	e.g. Diabetes Anaemia Frailty
Education and training	Curricula Resources	Working with HEE - curriculum, resources
Workforce	Insufficient Alternative workforce Transdisciplinary	Developing the workforce - career progression
Evaluation	QI/IS +/- traditional research	Linking with national audit/big data (GIRFT, PQIP, NELA/NHFD etc)

That's why CPOC is working on a Green paper on perioperative care

What is a **Green Paper**?

A document of policy proposals aimed at sparking dialogue, typically done at the start of a new agenda.

It's not the final word. Instead it should ...



Stimulate debate and discussion – with our sector, but also the wider health and care community



Set the direction of travel – for the next year, for the next 5 years, for the next 10 years (depending on the time frame of the GP)



Frame the issue – develop a compelling narrative, tell a good story, come up with the 'why' or 'for what' and the 'how'
