
training. His special interests include perioperative care, vascular anaesthesia and sustainable healthcare.

Professional Record Standards Body

As a key stakeholder, CPOC has endorsed the <u>Professional Records Standards Body (PRSB)</u> <u>Shared Decision Making Information Standard.</u>

The PRSB information standard on shared decision making provides a framework for clinicians to record the decision-making process between themselves and their patients. The standard also allows the shared decision information to be shared between professionals and their different record systems. The standard has been developed based on the <u>GMC guidance</u> on shared decision-making and consent and the <u>NICE guidelines</u>.

- The standard was developed with UK wide consultation and engagement to meet the needs of all four UK nations
- The standard is intended for all areas of healthcare except for the noted exclusions
- The standard covers all ages including children
